- Email correspondence through our applicant tracking system (ADP Workforce Now), which will always include a whrg.com email address in the body of the message.
- Direct emails or messages from Human Resources using a whrg.com address or verified communication through trusted job platforms such as LinkedIn or Indeed.

Our recruitment team will never request personal identifying information such as your Social Security number, birth certificate, driver's license, banking information, or passport details over the phone, email, or text message.
